# DENTAL LIFELINE NETWORK ALABAMA

Laura, age 16 and living in Alabaster, suffered from chronic pain. A screening concluded that she needed orthodontic care, but treatment was unaffordable to her family. Laura was referred to Donated Dental Services (DDS). Her case took the combined efforts of DDS volunteers Drs. Thomas (Gerry) Walker, a general dentist, and Stephanie Whitehead, an orthodontist, to end her years of pain. Severe malalignment created periodontal and occlusion complications, contributing to Laura's headaches. Dr. Walker completed four extractions to clear the way for braces on her upper and lower teeth. Two years later, Laura's braces were removed in time for her high school graduation. DDS brings together talented general dentists, specialists and volunteer dental laboratories who want to give back.
