Johnny is a 60-year-old U.S. Military veteran who lives in Barre. Prior to the onset of his disability, Johnny worked for nonprofit and mental health organizations. In 2012, painful dental disease and decay forced him to lose all his teeth. Relying solely on disability benefits, he was unable to afford dentures. Johnny had difficulty eating – which further complicated the diabetes he struggled to manage. Donated Dental Services (DDS) volunteer Dr. Agnes Hibbs, a general dentist, fitted Johnny with upper and lower dentures fabricated by Barth Dental Lab, one of five dental labs in Vermont that donate their services to DDS patients. Now able to chew his food, Johnny's diet has significantly improved and he is all smiles.
