# Hawaii Annual Report



#### The Story

John, 56, lives alone in Honolulu. In 2014 he survived an aortic aneurysm and shortly thereafter underwent heart bypass surgery. John also suffers from hypertension, mental health issues and chronic back and shoulder pain from a work injury.

In addition, John's oral health was in poor condition. All of his teeth were removed in 2014 to prepare for his surgery, but he has been unable to afford dentures. He often found it painful to eat and without teeth found it difficult to maintain a healthy diet.

Before his aneurysm, John worked in plumbing, although he has not been able to return to work since his surgery. He receives a small Social Security Disability benefit and is on Medicaid, which does not include dental benefits for adults. John just barely makes ends meet and could not afford the necessary dental treatment. It seemed he had nowhere to turn for help.

#### How DDS Helped

Fortunately, John was referred to the Donated Dental Services (DDS) program and he was linked with a very generous volunteer. Dr. Gina Viernes donated full dentures and her in-house lab fabricated the dentures at no cost.

This has changed my life. I cannot express the gratitude I feel for being chosen to be treated by Dr. Viernes and the assistance of Margaret Petrick. I'm forever grateful.
