THE STORY

Myrtle, 78, is a widow from Birmingham who lives alone and enjoys painting. She has overcome an incredible amount of challenges in her life. Years ago, she was in a car accident that broke her jaw and many of her teeth; she also survived a stroke, and as a result, has a weakness on one side of her body and uses a walker. Myrtle has fought breast cancer and recently, she fell and broke her hip and ankle.

In addition to these challenges, Myrtle's dental issues were also significant. With many missing and decayed teeth, she was in pain and her physician was concerned about her dental infections affecting her overall health. She was desperate for help but was unable to afford the dental treatment she needed. Myrtle survives on a Social Security benefit and struggles to make ends meet. Sadly, dental treatment appeared to be beyond her reach.

HOW DDS HELPED

Fortunately, Myrtle applied to the **Donated** Dental Services (DDS) program and was linked with two generous volunteers.

- Dr. Ken Friday restored three teeth, extracted 24 teeth and donated a full upper denture and a lower partial denture.
- Burdette Dental Laboratory fabricated a full upper denture and a partial lower denture at no cost.
