## THE STORY

Betty, 58, lives in Devils Lake with her aging father. In addition to caring for her father, she struggles with her own health challenges. She has central nervous system and sciatic nerve damage that cause her chronic pain and makes it difficult for her to work.

Sadly, Betty's dental health had also deteriorated: she had only two remaining teeth and both were decayed.

Though she receives some income for caring for her father and has a small Social Security Disability benefit, she struggles to make ends meet. She could not afford the dental treatment she needed.

## **HOW DDS HELPED**

After Betty was referred to **Donated** Dental Services (DDS), Dr. Benjamin Mack extracted her two remaining teeth, smoothed her jaw bone and with the help of Glidewell and Keystone Dental lab, donated a full upper denture and an implantretained lower denture.
