THE STORY

The Maine Donated Dental Services (DDS) program helps patients like Raymond, 69, who lives in Cumberland County. Raymond was a welder and pipefitter until he hurt his back in the mid 90's. After that, he was unable to work and became very depressed. Unfortunately, Raymond's dental health was another challenge. He was missing several teeth and others were broken, decayed, and infected. Unable to eat solid foods, he subsisted on nutritional drinks and had lost over 20 pounds as a result. Raymond desperately needed help with his declining dental health, but sadly, he could not afford the extensive treatment he needed on his own. Surviving on food stamps and a Social Security benefit, his fixed income is nearly consumed by his monthly living expenses, leaving very little leftover for any other needs. Dental treatment seemed far beyond his reach.

HOW DDS HELPED

This all changed when a team of DDS volunteers came to Raymond's aid. Dr. Matthew Jacobsen extracted 20 teeth and smoothed his jawbone in a hospital setting. Fortunately, Medicare covered the hospital room fee and anesthesia cost. Then, Dr. Anna Sweet and Port City Dental Lab partnered to provide full upper and lower dentures. Thanks to these caring volunteers, Raymond received thousands in donated treatment that restored his ability to eat and gave him a new reason to smile!
