Cancer Survivor Gets Her Smile Back

Jeannette is a 68-year-old Albany, GA resident who was diagnosed with breast and lung cancer in 2016. Although, she is now in remission from breast cancer, Jeannette continues to undergo radiation and chemotherapy treatments to fight the lung cancer.

Jeannette's dental health was another challenge. She was missing all but four of her teeth and her denture fit poorly. Sadly, Jeannette was unable to afford the dental treatment she needed.

Fortunately, Donated Dental Services (DDS) volunteer, Dr. Lou Ann Best, restored five teeth, removed two bone protrusions on her upper and lower jaw and, with the help of a volunteer lab, donated a full upper denture and lower partial denture.
