



Helping Those in Need

The Indiana Donated Dental Services (DDS) program helps people like Donald, 59, from Johnson County. Donald suffers from end-stage renal and pancreas failuire, diabetes, and arthritis among other things. He is need of both a kidney and pancreas transplant but is unable to qualify for the transplant due to his lack of dental clearance.

Unable to work due to his health issues, Donald survives on a Social Security disability benefit and was unable to afford the treatment needed to address his dental problems and get him the kidney and pancreas he desparately needed.

This all changed when 2 generous DDS volunteers came to his aid. A general dentist restored 10 teeth, a root canal and, with the help of a volunteer lab, 3 crowns. Thanks to these caring volunteers, Donald received thousands of dollars worth of donated treatment and the dental clearance needed to get him one step closer to transplant surgery.
